Description of Services

Electricity Week

It covers prices, law, policy and regulation for Federal, NSW, Qld, Vic, WA, NT, SA, Tasmania and the Snowy. *Electricity Week* reports on electricity, coal and gas prices, and on law, policy and regulation, for Australia. It reports in international issues where they have a direct impact in the Australian market.

Electricity Week was founded in 1986, and is owned by a small Sydney-based private firm, which has published *Electricity Week* and *Energy Daily* for 20 years, *Gas Week* and *Water Week*, for 10 years, and *Electricity Week Queensland* and *Carbon Week* for five years.

Electricity Week uses primary sources and covers all Hansards, Gazettes, and regulatory documents and submissions to policy-processes for electricity-market issues. It uses its own data-collation system, <http://www.erisk.net> to create daily and historic charts and graphs. It reports on market events and spike prices and rule-changes across retail, distribution, transmission and generation. It also reports on significant events and jobs.

Carbon Week uses primary sources and covers all Hansards, Gazettes, and regulatory documents and submissions to policy processes for carbon-market issues. It also reports on significant events and jobs.

Gas Week

Gas Week reports on oil and gas markets for Federal, NSW, Qld, Vic, WA, NT, SA, Tasmania and Timor Leste. It covers offshore and pipelines. It reports on gas prices, and provides a daily price and volume for the Victorian market. It reports on the national gas pool, as it evolves, with the two hubs for Sydney and Adelaide.

Gas Week reports on law, policy and regulation, and project-approval processes, both State and Federal. Its coverage extends to CO2 dumps, geothermal, coal seam gas, natural gas, LNG, LPG and CNG. It covers retail and wholesale contract prices. It reports on international issues where they have a direct impact in the Australian market, and covers the law policy and regulation and security issues in relation to threats to plants.

Gas Week was founded in 1986, and is owned by a small Sydney-based private firm, which has also published *Electricity Week* and *Energy Daily* for 20 years, *Gas Week* and *Water Week* for 10 years, and *Electricity Week Queensland* and *Carbon Week* for five years.

Gas Week uses primary sources and covers all Hansards, Gazettes, as well as EPBC filings, stock exchange, prospectus, annual and quarterly reports, exploration tenders, regulatory documents and submissions to policy-processes for gas-market issues. It uses its own data-collation

system, <http://www.erisk.net> to create daily and historic charts and graphs for gas generation and market risk. It reports on market events, emergency actions and rule-changes across retail, distribution, transmission and generation. It also reports on significant events and policy conflicts. Data published may include exchange rates, gas and oil prices, geothermal, and CO2 dump prices. It also publishes significant jobs and events.

Gas Week references all its news items, and generally provides a link to the original source document. It may also include the names and phone numbers of authors of papers and submissions. Its data-service provides prices for the National Electricity Market.

Water Week

Water Week reports water-prices, volumes, floods, drought and climate change; and law, policy and regulation for Federal, NSW, Qld, Vic, WA, NT, SA, Tasmania and the Snowy. It reports on retail and wholesale, urban and rural, catchments and land-management. It provides weekly reports on flows and volumes in the Murray Darling Basin. *Water Week* reports on water-resource conflicts between stakeholders in irrigation, town use and industrial use, and water-policy and practice impacts on gas and electricity services. It publishes data on water levels and on income earned by hydro generators.

Water Week was founded in 1996, is owned by a small Sydney-based private firm, which has published *Electricity Week* and *Energy Daily* for 20 years, *Gas Week* for 10 years, and *Electricity Week Queensland* and *Carbon Week* for five years.

Water Week uses primary sources, government and water authority sources, and covers all Hansards, Gazettes, and regulatory documents and submissions to policy-processes for water-market issues. Energy Daily and Realtime NEM Data

The Energy Daily Real Time Data service provides data about the National Electricity market, (NEM) and the evolving national gas market.

Electricity Data goes back 8 years, and contains 5 minute data-series each all the regions of the NEM; NSW, Qld, South Australia, Tasmania and Victoria. It also supplies power station earnings reports and emissions liabilities. Data is available as graphs, csvs or tables.

New data-sets and analysis tools are constantly being made available to provider better insites into

the market, and in response to keep abreast of market changes, particularly in the Gas market.

Energy Daily was founded in 1986, and is owned by a small Sydney-based private firm, which has published *Electricity Week* and *Energy Daily* for 20 years, *Gas Week* and *Water Week*, for 10 years, and *Electricity Week Queensland* and *Carbon Week* for five years.

5. NEW - coming soon; DIY tools to create and publish your own private searches, as pdfs, by keyword, or topics, or regions.

**Rates and agreements for 2010 Calendar Year:
Plain English summary**

Rates: Each Australian service is \$A1412 per quarter. Overseas purchase rate is EU1260 a quarter. Each, minimum, 4 quarters, terms, paid in advance. The subscription pays for specialist news, data and tools. Rates may change annually for the Calendar year and will generally rise or fall with the Australian average Consumer Price Index (CPI).

You also get *Media Mogul*; you or your teams can use *Media Mogul* to create and broadcast your own gas, electricity, and water or carbon news-summary pdfs; just chose topics, keywords and date ranges, and click.

10 or 10,000 for the same price: The subscription permits use by all staff within the subscriber company. You can freely send the daily and weekly summary pdfs to any party inside or outside the company, (but in their original form only and from your company's servers). The subscription does not apply to contractors to the company; but you may send summary pdfs to contractors, but not supply your password. Your subscription pays for website access. Password free intranet service available for no extra charge to subscribers.

Create your own publications: You can now automatically create your own summary pdfs for any sub-topic, or any date-range. For example, if you lose a daily or weekly issue, you can create another. Or, you can create a one-month review of your choice of topic, (for example, "CSM, CSG, coal seam methane"; or, say, "desalination").

License rights: Your subscription pays for website access to a topic service. Each site contains news and data (updated throughout the day), bookmarks and bookmark tools, and 8-10 years news (or data) in the subject set.

Services in holiday periods: The news service is 52 weeks. Data services operate 24 hours, 356 days for 81 data series for each of the regions of the National Electricity Market.

Public holidays: News services will slow in Australian public holiday periods; volume will reduce from about 6 December to about 15 January. From February full service will ramp up to report on Commonwealth Queensland, NSW, Victoria, South Australia, the Australian Capital Territory, Tasmania, Northern Territory and Western Australia parliamentary sittings. Weeks bookended by national public-holiday days will also see a lowered volume. Parliaments usually do not sit in these weeks, and these weeks also tend to

match Australian school and university holidays.

The weeks of reduced volume are: 25–29 February; 24–28 March; 21-15 April; 9-13 June; 7-25 July; 3-7 November.

EWN owns copyright: You may not resell or re-use the service in any form outside the subscriber company without a written license.

The service is for internal use within the subscriber company. The license agreement does not apply to groups of companies. Each company needs a separate subscription. Exceptions to this rule require a written agreement with each annual subscription.

Renewals: We will send you reminders of the renewal date. From 2010, service will automatically cease when the term expires. No refunds of unused portions of subscriptions will be made.

Passwords: You have the option to use one password for the whole company, or individual passwords (individual passwords enable tailored set-ups for individual sophisticated users). If you supply a static IP address or addresses, you get "password-free" access, company-wide. Password is case-sensitive.

To Order: Please send us your *Order*. We will reply with a *Tax Invoice*. Or, you can use the form below. You send that to us, and we create an invoice and send it to you. You then pay on the invoice. We then supply the service. Later in the year we aim to provide an online enrolment and payment option.

Service start: Your service begins on the day of receipt of payment.
